Daily Itinerary

DAY 1: TUESDAY 26th JULY, 2011

- Depart San Antonio International Airport at 2:45 p.m. on American Airlines flight #1655 to Dallas Fort Worth International Airport
- Arrive in Dallas at 3:55 p.m. and transfer to American Airlines flight #50 to London Heathrow International Airport, departing at 4:50 p.m.

DAY 2: WEDNESDAY 27th JULY, 2011

- Arrive in London at 7:50 a.m. where our full time Quest Sports Travel Tour Manager meets the group to transfer by private motor coach to the historic city of **Windsor**, home of Queen Elizabeth II's favorite residence
- Free time to explore the old town and maybe cross the River Thames to visit England's most prestigious private school **Eton**
- Continue to the mysterious **Stonehenge** - This huge circle of lintels and megalithic pillars, believed to be 5,000 years old, is the most important prehistoric monument in Britain. Generally believed to a religious site of the Druids, others contend that Stonehenge was a prehistoric astronomical observatory - a Neolithic "computing machine" capable of predicting eclipses!
- Continue to the port city of **Bristol** and **check in** to a local hotel for a 2 night stay in twin bedded rooms
- Dinner at the hotel and free time to discover **Bristol**, the largest city in the West Country and just across the Bristol Channel from Wales. Bristol has long been rich in seafaring traditions and has many links with the early colonization of America - be sure to explore the colorful harbor as well as the rejuvenated docks area with its cutting-edge restaurants, designer bars and world-class museums

DAY 3: THURSDAY 28th JULY, 2011

- After breakfast depart to visit **Bath**, one of the loveliest cities in England - Settled by the Romans over 2000 years ago, and a popular spa resort for centuries, Bath remains one of England's most impressive attractions with stylish regency architecture and the famous **Roman Pump Rooms** and Bath House. Despite German bombing efforts during WWII, remarkable restoration and planning have ensured that Bath retains its handsome look
- Free time to discover Bath and have lunch on your own, then transfer this afternoon to the tour's **first friendly game** against a local club
- Return to the hotel for dinner after the game

DAY 4: FRIDAY 29th JULY, 2011

- Breakfast at the hotel then check out and depart for the English northwest
- Travel directly to **Old Trafford** and a guided tour of the home of the World's most popular club, **Manchester United**
- Immerse yourself in the club's history; marvel at the magnificent trophy room; test your skills on the interactive exhibits; and enjoy the remarkable atmosphere as you walk down the player's tunnel, view the field from the dugout, and sit in the Home Team Dressing Room
- From Old Trafford transfer to **check in** to a local hotel for a 2 night stay
- Dinner at the hotel this evening

DAY 5: SATURDAY 30th JULY, 2011

- After breakfast depart for the **second friendly game** against a local club team
- Transfer this afternoon to attend to attend this afternoon pre-season exhibition **professional game** - within 35 miles of Manchester are no less than 8 Premier League teams!
- Return to the hotel for dinner this evening

- Breakfast at the hotel then head south to central England and the 'Black Country'
- Travel to the magnificent **Warwick Castle**. Built in 1068 this classic medieval fortress has been home to numerous Kings and Royalty of the Realm, and is the traditional stronghold of central England. The castle offers attractions including descent into the dungeons, a remarkably stocked armory and torture room, splendidly decorated Royal quarters, battlement walks and even a Ghost Tour!
- Lunch on your own in nearby **Stratford-upon-Avon**, the home of William Shakespeare, then continue south and check in to a London area hotel for a 3 night stay in twin bedded rooms
- Dinner at the hotel this evening

DAY 7: MONDAY 1st AUGUST, 2011

- After breakfast depart for an **introductory tour of London** - Travel along the River Thames towards Westminster with the Houses of Parliament, Big Ben and Westminster Abbey, then along Whitehall, passing 10 Downing Street, Trafalgar Square and Piccadilly Circus
- Conclude the tour at **Buckingham Palace**, city residence of Queen Elizabeth II, for the traditional ceremony of the **Changing of the Royal Guard**
- Lunch on your own and free time in **London**, then transfer to the tour's **third friendly game**
- Dinner at the hotel this evening

DAY 8: TUESDAY 2nd AUGUST, 2011

- Breakfast at the hotel then return to London via a photo op at the 1000 year old Tower of London and neighboring St. Catherine's Docks.
- Lunch on your own then enjoy a free afternoon to further explore **London** - be sure to wander Oxford Street for affordable shopping; Regent Street for more upscale department stores; and Carnaby Street, home of modern boutiques. Alternatively take a cruise on the River Thames or a flight on the Millennium Wheel
- Return to the hotel for an early dinner then transfer this evening to attend a second pre-season exhibition **professional game**

DAY 9: WEDNESDAY 3rd AUGUST, 2011

- Check out after breakfast and depart for London Heathrow International Airport for the return journey to the United States
- Depart London at 10:25 a.m. on American Airlines flight #51 to Dallas Fort Worth International Airport, arriving in Dallas at 2:20 p.m.
- Transfer in Dallas to American Airlines flight #1043 departing at 4:30 p.m. and arriving in San Antonio at 5:30 p.m.
